



#### **HS Outcomes:**


- Most students graduate in 4 years, but others either drop out or continue in school.
  - Some who continue then graduate in 5 years
  - Both 4-year and 5-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates are reported to USED annually
  - By definition, 5-year grad rates are higher than 4year rates


5-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate All Students, Students in Special Ed, and Students Not in Special Ed



Class of 2014 5-year grad rates similarly increased over Class of 2013 rates for both students in special education and those not in special education.


5-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates Students in Special Ed and not in Special Ed, by Race



Class of 2014 5-year grad rates are lower for students in special education than for students not in special education, across all racial groups.

# **Problem/Opportunity:**

#### 5-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates for Students in and not in Special Ed (and for Sp Ed, by race)



Class of 2014 5-year grad rates increased over Class of 2013 rates for nearly all racial groups of students in special education.
