
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TOPIC TEACHING: How to Climb out of Mental Valleys (Why it Matters to Creativity & Innovation)

Jennifer Phillips with the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) presented a topic teaching on mental valleys and default thought patterns. In her presentation, she covered how to:

- Identify the valleys as well as natural assumptions
- Overcome traditional/autopilot thinking patterns
- Leverage lean tools and other user design methods to spark innovative and creative thinking

GROUP ACTIVITY: Overcoming Mental Valleys

- List the who, what, when, where, and how
- > Ask a lot of questions!
