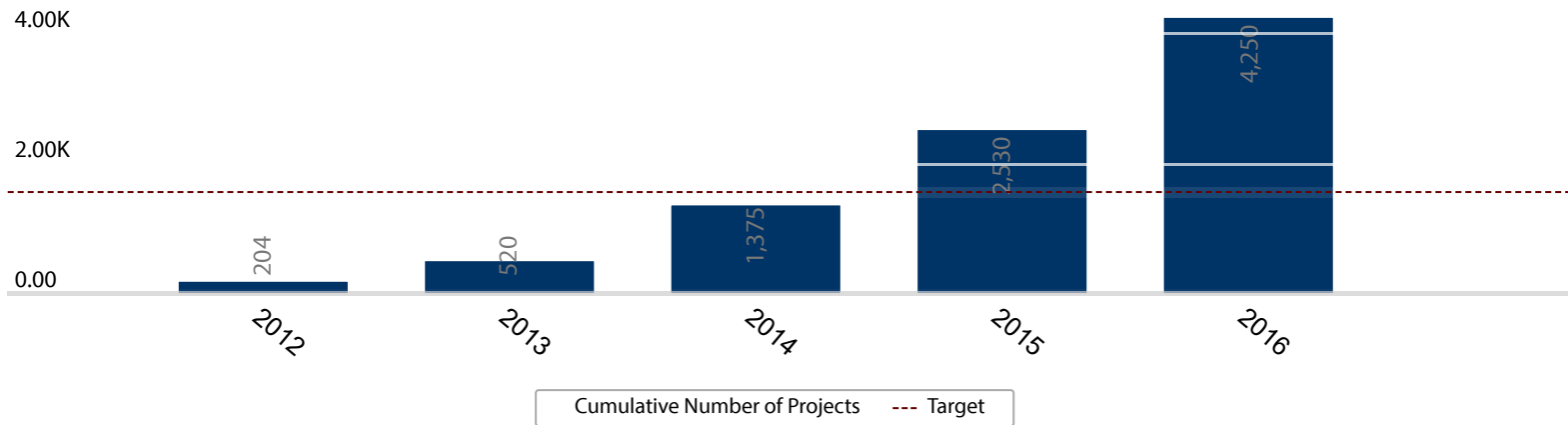




## 2.1.a: Increase number of lean projects by 25% from 2,351 to 3,164 by December 31, 2016

Through December 2016, the cumulative total of lean projects is 4,250. Agencies report new projects as well as previously reported projects that are continuing to move through the cycle of continuous problem solving for improvement.
