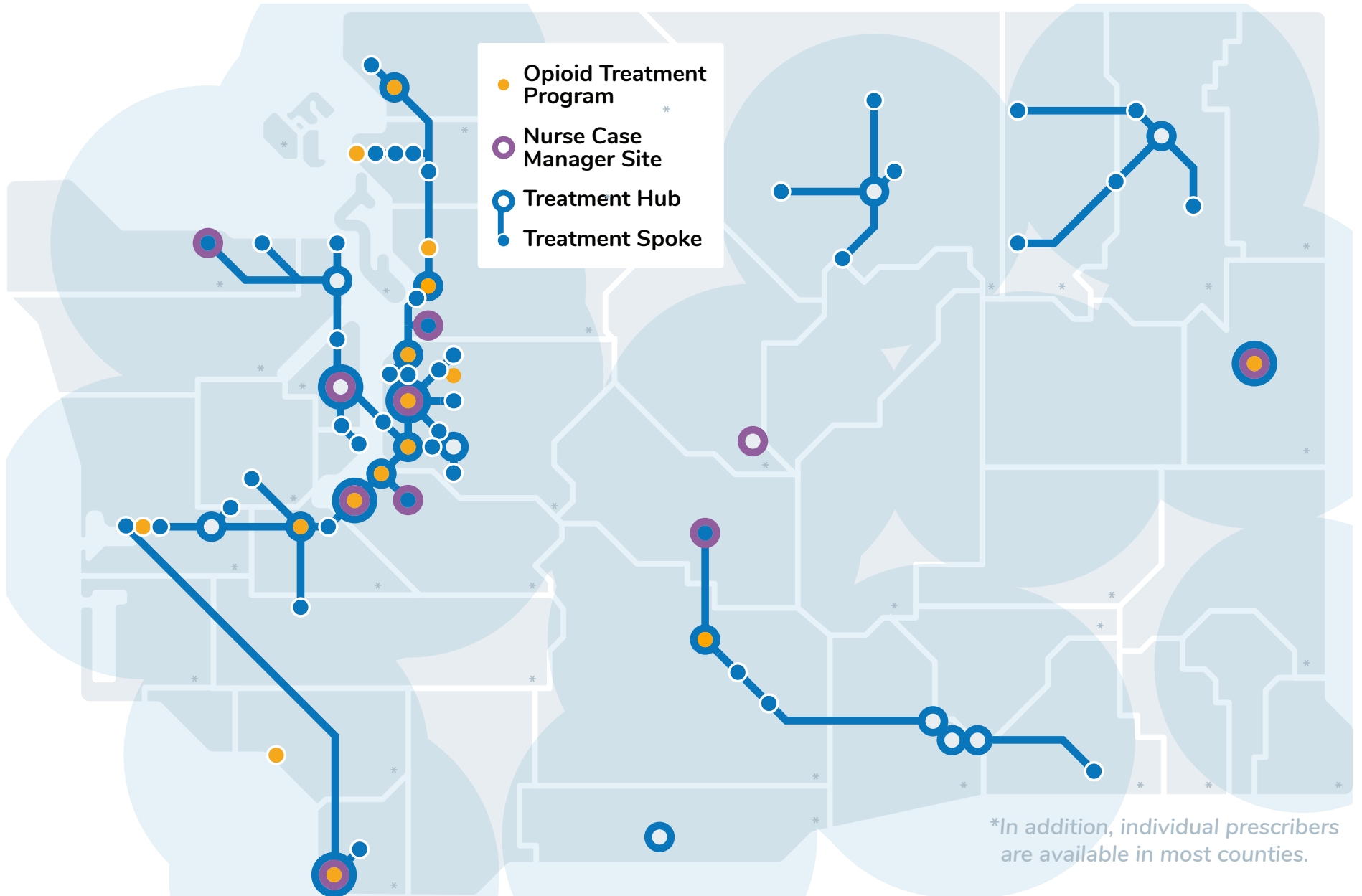


# Statewide Hub-and-Spoke Opioid Treatment Network

## Offering Medication Assisted Treatment



**Opioid treatment programs** are licensed behavioral health agencies that offer both substance use disorder counseling services and medical services, which allow individuals to be dispensed any of the three FDA approved medications for the treatment of opioid use disorder (Methadone, Buprenorphine, Naltrexone).

**Nurse care managers** are embedded within medical practices, jails and opiate treatment programs to coordinate care for patients and providers.

**Hub and spoke networks** use a hub (facility where staff are certified to prescribe addiction treatment drugs such as Suboxone) and spokes (other places a person might find help for opioid use disorder, such as a residential treatment facility, therapist's office, drug court, tribal medical facility, or ER).

**Opioid treatment networks** are similar to hub and spoke model, but could be a single initiation and treatment site, or multiple referral sites. They enhance the capacity of organizations to initiate MAT and then refer the patient to community providers for treatment, regardless of provider location or size of community.
