

Cabinet Agencies' Performance Audit Action Item(s) & Status

Initiative 1163: Long-Term Care Worker Certification Requirements

(See also <u>cabinet agency response</u> for full context to Washington State Auditor's Office (SAO) <u>report</u>, January 2013)

Agencies included in the performance audit: Department of Health (DOH) and Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS)

SAO Issues Summary:

- 1. DSHS has regulatory oversight of assisted living and adult family homes. DSHS relies on Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) and contracted businesses to provide oversight of home care agency employees. A list of long-term care employees working for facilities and agencies is not maintained. SAO recommends:
 - a) DSHS review the list of 288 provider applicants that did not meet certification requirements to determine whether they have completed the process since the conclusion of our audit work. If these applicants are not certified, we recommend the agency take appropriate action in accordance with the initiative directives
- 2. Not all long-term care providers hired beginning January 7, 2012, met the certification requirements within the required timeframes. SAO recommends:
 - a) DSHS should review processes designed and used to identify providers who have missed Initiative deadlines (including those hired by external parties) and ensure these processes are sufficient to ensure these unqualified providers are restricted from serving clients until they have met all certification requirements.
 - b) DSHS should review methods used to monitor home care agencies and facilities and ensure these methods are sufficient to ensure workers hired by these agencies are certified.
 - c) DOH obtain each applicant's hire date and enter this date into its licensing system. DOH should require applicants to submit an employer verification form to ensure this date is accurate.
