SAO Issues Summary:

- 1. Harvest estimation challenges make it difficult for the Department to assess how well it is managing the fishery and meeting Rafeedie Decision requirements.
- 2. The Department follows best practices and fulfills the intent of Commission policy for crab fishery management but conducts limited monitoring of other factors that can threaten the resource.

The SAO had recommended that the department should discontinue the daily commercial reporting requirement once it achieves an acceptable level of confidence in the accuracy of the harvest information. Status The Department has achieved a goal to improve in-season accuracy and timelines of processing commercial fish receiving tickets. Improvements to the reporting system have resulted in the elimination of one in-season reporting system that was deemed unnecessary. In addition, changes were made to commercial buyer requirements that allow for electronic email reports to be submitted as an alternative to a fax report. These changes have resulted in a more efficient and streamlined catch accounting system that requires less staff time and is more cost efficient overall. Furthermore, the Department is currently collaborating with the Northwest Indian Fishery Commission on the design and development of a
