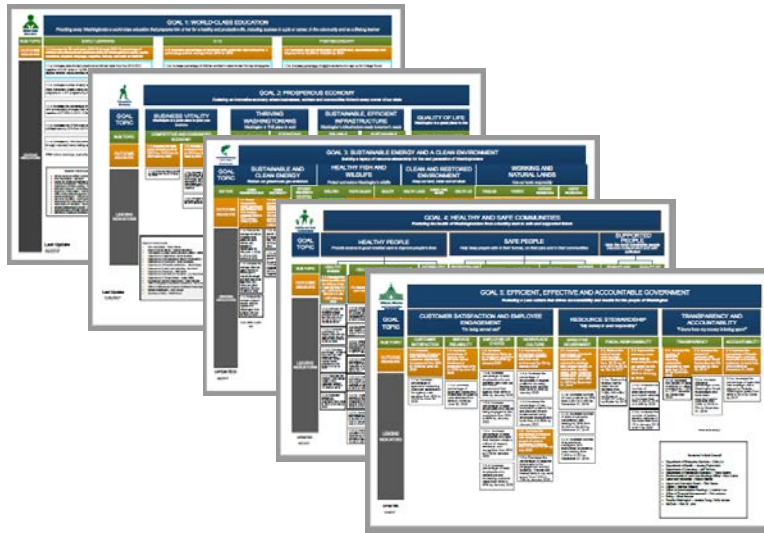

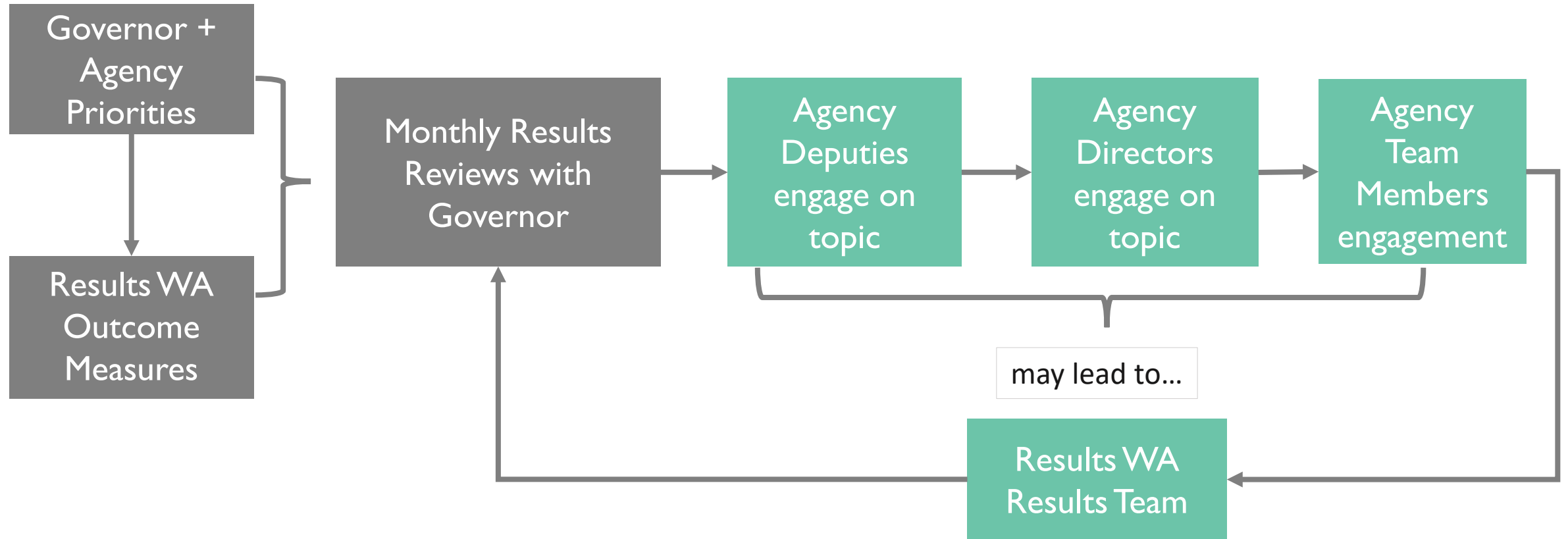

RCW 28A.230.158

Findings—2008 c 167: "The legislature finds that annually recognizing disability history throughout our entire public educational system, from kindergarten through grade twelve and at our colleges and universities, during the month of October will help to increase awareness and understanding of the contributions that people with disabilities in our state, nation, and the world have made to our society. The legislature further finds that recognizing disability history will increase respect and promote acceptance and inclusion of people with disabilities. The legislature further finds that recognizing disability history will inspire students with disabilities to feel a greater sense of pride, reduce harassment and bullying, and help keep students with disabilities in school." 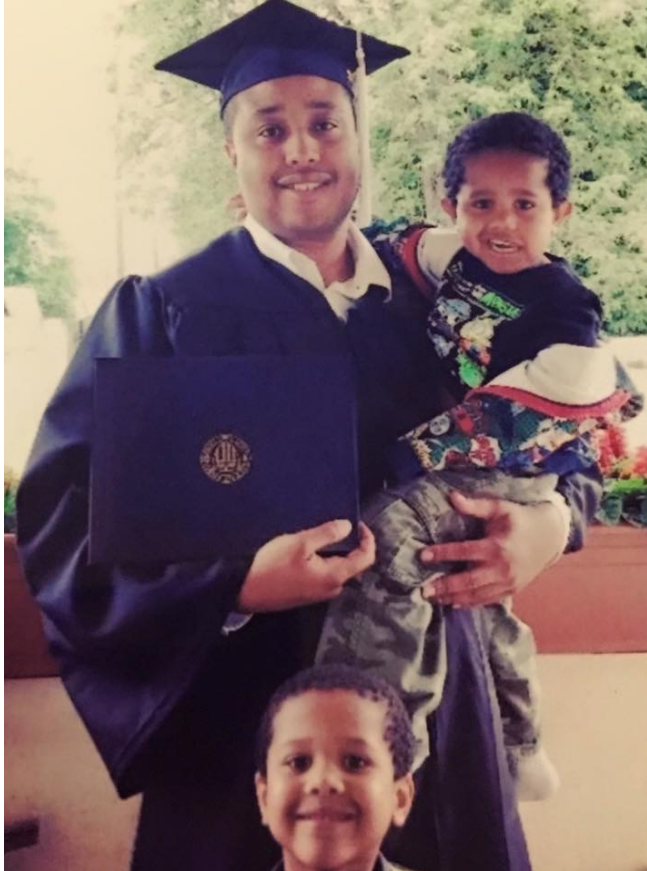

Reducing the transition time For people to find the right job

Provide services for incarcerated persons prior to release

- Employability skills building
- Resources/information for a warm handoff
- Job/Resource Fairs - Mock Interviewing events

Engage persons actively supervised in the community

- Outreach and enrollment of Jail and Work Release residents
- Orientation to WorkSource services
- Skills development, Soft Referrals for Supportive Services

- Business Outreach Partnerships to support reentry

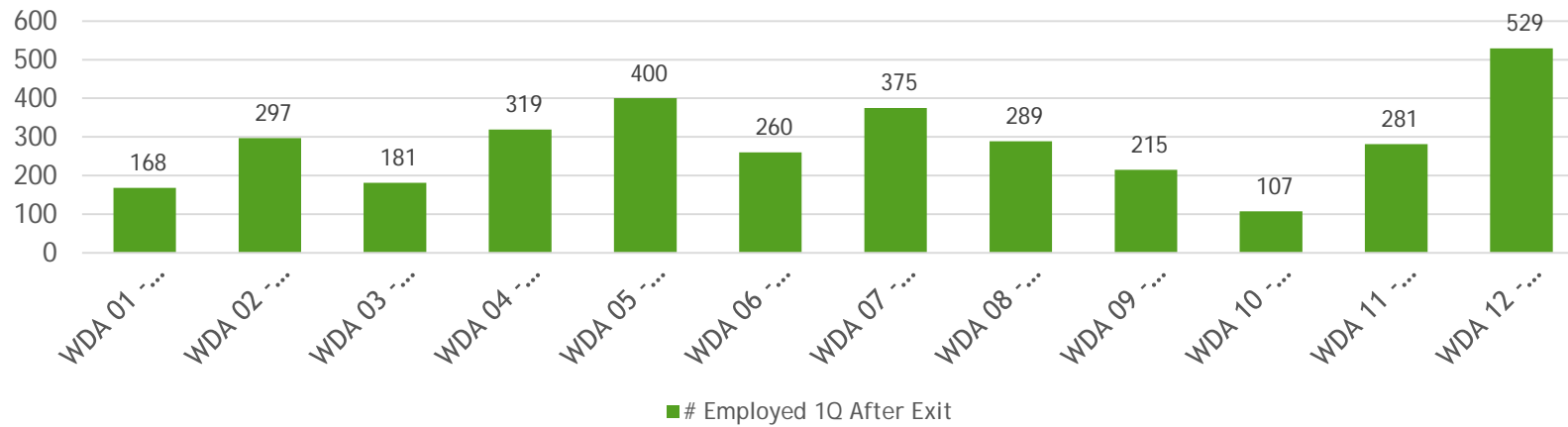
Ensuring sustainable initiatives/efforts

- ✓ Agency and Division Strategic Goals support strong partnerships that provide seamless services for customers.
- ✓ Technology systems are being improved resulting in more robust data tracking and reporting.
- ✓ Staff and Partner Reentry Training improve service delivery and organizational effectiveness.
- ✓ Reentry tools and resources are posted and updated on a Share Point site
- ✓ Acquiring and analyzing customer feedback to develop and refine our efforts.

Interagency Alignment

Common Clients, Common Needs

- Identocard Program – provides WA state ID cards to individuals releasing from Washington prisons
- Child Support Modifications – provides structure and engagement to non-custodial parents upon admission to address child support obligations while incarcerated
- Transitional Support Pilot – pre-screening and pre-enrolling individuals for public assistance programs prior to release

ACCESSING VETERAN ADMINISTRATION PROGRAMS BEHIND THE WIRE

- SCCC American Legion Post 23-established February 2019
- WCCW American Legion Post 204 external to DOC
- Posts offer the member incentives to fulfill their mission to support Veterans taking care of Veterans
 - Provide continuous services, counseling, training, and peer mentorship and create a support system of men and women with common experiences and goals.
- DOC /WDVA
 - Veterans and their families are connected to their earned benefits & entitlements
 - Brings in Federal money to it's Veteran population thus reducing State expenses
 - Reduce recidivism
