 - *Continue work underway:*
 - Partner with Conservation Districts and Ecology to complete an assessment of rivers/streams
 - Provide Conservation Districts with technical assistance to increase landowner participation
 - Identify potential partner fund sources to support state funding for additional incentives in high value Ag land areas. Work with partners to develop program with additional incentives.
 - Develop 45-47 FY17 budget decision package requesting funds to conduct pilot project in Nooksack watershed.
- What would it take to reach the target? Is external help needed (i.e., Goal Council, Governor, etc...)?
 - Fund “CREP Riparian Contract” at level reflective of time required to implement projects. SCC will analyze and develop this recommendation.
 - Support incentive programs as landowner motivations are understood and incentives are developed.
 - Additional funding for managing re-enrollment contracts to retain contracts in the program.

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
