Legislatively requested

Look at economic contribution of outdoor recreation statewide and from state's public lands.

Purpose



Economic Benefits

\$21.6 BILLION Spent in Washington on recreation trips and equipment annually.

199,000 JOBS Direct and indirect JOBS supported in Washington.

\$2 BILLION LOCAL AND STATE TAXES COLLECTED.

\$4.6 BILLION Spent by out-of-state visitors. For every \$1 they spend, \$1.36 is generated.



Results

Washingtonians Love to Recreate

Statewide = 445 million days a year Individuals = 56 days a year

Outdoor Recreation Draws Out-of-State Visitors

- \$4.6 billion spent by tourists
 For every \$1 they spend, \$1.36 is generated.
- Supported
 - 46,430 jobs or 23 percent of total
 - 12 percent of participant days
 - 27 percent of total outdoor recreation spending, not including equipment purchases.
